Standards of Conduct & Camp Rules

1. **DO NOT BRING:** offensive/immodest clothing, tobacco products, vapes, alcohol, matches/lighters, fireworks, knives, firearms, electronic games, computers, tablets, extra cash, soda pop, candy, gum, or other perishable products.
**Prohibited items will be collected at camp check-in or when they are found and held until the camp is over.

2. **CELL PHONE POLICY:** All cell phones must be left at home or with a faculty member upon signing in at the beginning of camp. Though this might seem unfair, it is the best way we can ensure the safety and well-being of all campers. Should a camper feel the need to communicate with their parent/guardian at any time, they will have the freedom to do so by reaching out to any staff member.

3. No one is permitted to leave the camp grounds without the permission of the Director.

4. Camp life is group centered. Splitting off from the main group, in any way, is not permitted.

5. Cabins will be inspected for cleanliness daily.

6. Campers must not borrow anything from other campers or staff.

7. There must not be any improper display of affection. Boys need to stay away from the girls' cabins, and girls need to stay away from the boys' cabins.

8. Vulgar and profane language will not be permitted.

9. Property deliberately damaged or destroyed will be paid for or replaced by the individual(s) responsible.

10. Keep the camp clean. All staff and campers are expected to assist in maintaining the cleanliness of camp Sunday night through Saturday morning.

11. Any visitors to the camp must check in with the Director upon arrival and follow the same rules as everyone else.

12. All rules are expected to be followed by everyone at camp, throughout the entirety of each session.
